



Late teacher drove Pottstown senior to succeed - Pottstown High School senior Daniel Fishburn-Diehl said he was the kind of kid who never thought about going to college. He thought he didn't need



school. But then he started taking auto technology classes as a freshman with William Bertoti. Diehl was impressed by his passion for cars and the fact that he owned a repair shop as well as taught.

"He turned it around for me," Diehl said. Bertoti died last year of non-Hodgkin's lymphoma at the age of 65. He had graduated from Pottstown and started teaching auto shop classes in the district after his former teacher retired in 1993. He worked there for over 20 years. Bertoti was also one of the earliest members of the Pottstown Classics Car Club. The club's president, Tony Ziemba, decided to

establish a scholarship fund in Bertoti's honor. Diehl was the first recipient of a scholarship from the Willy Bertoti Memorial Scholarship Fund. He received \$2,000 to study automotive technology at the Universal Technical Institute near Exton, Chester County. The school also gave Diehl \$2,500 for a total of \$4,500 for him to put toward his education.
